We are very excited to welcome our new Special Advisor to the Vice President, Dr. Nahir I. Otaño Gracia. She is an Associate Professor of English and Medieval Studies. Dr. Otaño Gracia will coordinate efforts that contribute to Objective 5 (student success) of Goal 3 (Inclusive Excellence) of 2040 Opportunity Defined https://opportunity.unm.edu/index.html.

In her own words:

"Have you ever felt that your life choices have led you to something special? This is how I feel about joining the Division for Change & Empowerment at UNM; that I am exactly where I am meant to be. The last decade of my academic career—my research, teaching, and service—has been defined by a desire to remove the obstacles that stop me, my students, and my colleagues (both faculty and staff) from reaching our goals; and to create and promote scholarship that recovers the past by focusing on what has been left unsaid, what has been omitted, and what has been deprioritized by previous scholarship. For example, my monograph The Other Face of Arthur: Chivalric Whiteness in the Global North Atlantic (Penn 2025), which reveals the role of Arthuriana in the racial logics of medieval Europe through an analysis of the construction of chivalric whiteness, was met with extreme resistance by my field and was rejected and discarded several times without providing me with feedback. My response has been to create as many opportunities as possible for those around me: From taking on a number of editorial projects that allow my colleagues to publish their innovative research to providing free workshops on professionalization, teaching, and the job market, my commitments are to creating a space in which those around me do not experience the same lack of mentorship and support that I did when I started this journey.

I am so excited to join the Division for Change & Empowerment, and I hope you come visit, say hi, and let me know how I can help!"
